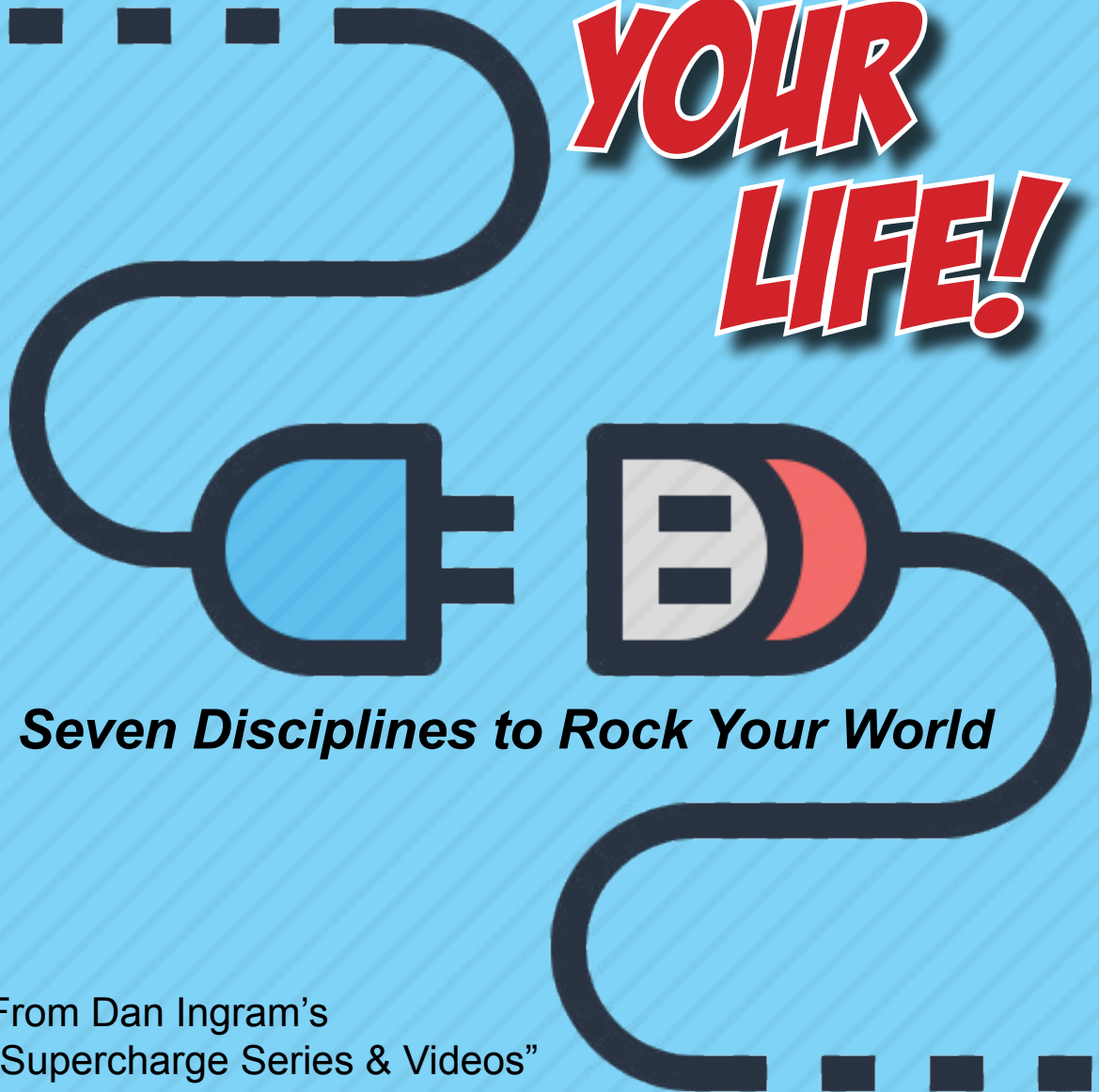

There is a commercial for an energy drink where they show people with a battery above each person's head. The battery's show varying levels of energy remaining in each person. No worries though, just a gulp of this energy drink will put you back on full.

We want to supercharge our phone's and supercharge our energy levels to get more done, but what about supercharging our lives, our souls, so that we may live our lives with more passion, more energy, more love and more supernatural power from God?

Looking at our world today, it's easy for our souls to be depleted of hope, of joy, and of faith. People turn to all kinds of things to supercharge their lives, some good and some bad, but only God can supercharge our souls with meaning and purpose that cannot be depleted or run out.

God does not lack what we need. God is inexhaustible. God is called Jehovah Jireh in the old Testament and it means "The LORD Will Provide" Genesis 22:14. God created us and knows that we run out of the essential things that make life worth living. This is why God invites us over and over again to come to Him when we run low on strength, faith, hope, and love.

The source of every good and perfect thing we need comes from God James 1:17. What do you need that God cannot supply? Nothing. God is the giver of all good things and wants to supercharge our lives so that we may live for Him and in Him.

Part of our issue with believing that God **can** supercharge our lives is believing that God **wants** to supercharge our lives even when we see ourselves as unworthy of such a blessing.

God is not waiting for us to be perfect. He does not secretly mock us when we run low on "spiritual energy" and flounder. Look at the disciple Peter. He jumped out of a boat in the middle of the sea because Jesus bid him to come to him. Peter had almost made it but started to look around at the wind and the waves and started to sink. Jesus did not mock Peter because he ran out of faith, instead, he saved him.

Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.—Ephesians 3:20-21

Supercharge Your Finances

Money is not an ugly word. Everyone misquotes I Timothy 6:10 to say that money is evil, here is what it actually says,

*For the **love of money** is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.*

There is nothing wrong with even liking money. I mean, if you have a choice between more or less money, which would you prefer? I would prefer more money, please. Since money, itself, is not the issue; if we are struggling in our finances or want to go to another level, let's find a way to supercharge our finances so we can be a blessing to others as well as meet our own needs.

In terms of giving, this verse is often used, to get people to give in obedience:

Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it.

Malachi 3:10

If you read the whole book, you begin to understand that Israel and even the priests of the temple had become corrupt and wayward. They had gotten sloppy in their obedience to God and how they were regarding the temple. God, like a good father, rebukes them, tells them (through Malachi) how to make it right and then offers a superabundance of blessing for that obedience. It is like God is saying, "It is in your best interest to be a giver and restore glory back to my name. Stop being sloppy with your obedience."

The food God speaks of was the tithe brought of food so the priests could eat because they had dedicated their whole life to the temple and to accepting the sacrifices of the nations sins. They had to eat and the people were dropping the ball in their giving.

God goes one step further by promising them that if they did their part in meeting this need, He'd do even more than they could imagine. God desires that for us as well. Our church communities have needs and our obedience in giving will bring blessings to them and to us as well.

Our giving brings glory to God because our hearts believe God deserves our best. Our giving helps to meet the needs, build and propel the kingdom of God in the earth!

God is not asking us to do anything He has not already done.

God is a giver.

For God so loved the world, he gave his only begotten son. John 3:16

If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him? Luke 11:13

Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. James 1:17

God gives to us that He might give through us. When our hearts belong to God, we won't get fixated on the ten percent or what Holy Spirit has said to give, rather we'll dedicate all we have to God and be glad to give more when God gives us opportunity to respond to a need.

God favors us when we give

In Malachi, God is saying, if you'll trust me with your small things, I'll bring to you big things. If you'll let go of what you hold so tightly in your small hands, I'll let go of what's in my big hands. God's hands are bigger than ours and the blessing He releases is super-sized compared to what we give. In other words, God is saying, "I'll supercharge your finances so you can become even a bigger giver and meet even more needs in my Kingdom."

God increases our supply

Jesus said,

Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. Luke 6:38

Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your store of seed and will increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous on every occasion, and your giving through us will produce thanksgiving to God... II Corinthians 9:10,11

God gives to us so that we might be “generous on every occasion” and in being generous “produces thanksgiving to God”. When one of our needs is met, unexpectedly, do we not shout, “Praise the Lord”! Or “Thank you Jesus”! Someone gave so our need could be met, and our praise is poured out to the Father.

So wherever you are on the financial ladder in life, or regardless of the financial difficulties, if you will start to live by kingdom principles, your obedience will bring kingdom results. God blesses our obedience to reveal Himself and show His promises are true.

God wants you to be blessed so you can be a blessing to others and bring glory to his Name.

Supercharge Your Life With Prayer

Why is prayer not our first choice when we get in trouble? Because, prayer is not a habit. Praying requires us to humble ourselves and admit that we do not have things figured out. Oh, we will try our best and exhaust every human endeavor until our backs are up against the wall. Even then, we don't know what to pray or how to pray because it is not our native tongue. Would you like to change that? Would you like to supercharge your prayer life and make talking to God a dynamic experience? Then, let's do this!

To supercharge our prayer lives, we must throw out our old ideas of prayer.

Prayer is boring - Only if we do not expect anything.

Prayer doesn't work - Only if we don't combine it with faith.

Prayer is for the weak - Only if we think we can handle everything.

Prayer is for church - Only if you believe God only shows up at church.

Prayer is for certain times of the day - Only if you believe God sleeps.

Once we clear out the negativity and doubt surrounding prayer we can let scripture teach us what prayer is all about. Consider James who wrote:

Therefore, confess your sins to one another [your false steps, your offenses], and pray for one another, that you may be healed and restored. The heartfelt and persistent prayer of a righteous man (believer) can accomplish much [when put into action and made effective by God—it is dynamic and can have tremendous power].

James 5:16 Amplified Bible

James knew the power of prayer. He had seen healing and restoration occur because of prayer. He knew that persistent prayers by pure hearted people resulted in powerful experiences.

Consider the story of Peter, locked up in prison for spreading the message of Jesus.

So, Peter was kept in prison, but fervent and persistent prayer for him was being made to God by the church. Acts 12:5

Jesus told us, "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." Matthew 18:20. The church gathered, prayed and believed and then this happened:

The very night before Herod was to bring him forward, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries were in front of the door guarding the prison. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared [beside him] and a light shone in the cell. The angel struck Peter's side and awakened him, saying, "Get up quickly!" And the chains fell off his hands. Acts 12: 6,7

When we pray, God shows up. He doesn't always how we want him to or even when we want Him to, but He does show up. In this case, God answered a very specific prayer and showed up in a supernatural way. All of God's ways are supernatural, big or small. God may send real angels to deliver the answer or the "angels" called good friends or even strangers to meet our needs.

The church, in Peter's case prayed fervently and persistently. Could it be that your prayer life is less than effective because you are neither fervent or persistent? The Greek word for fervency has a few meanings

ektenós (an adverb) – properly, fully-stretched, to its necessary (full) potential ("without slack"); strenuously, without undue let up.

Are you stretching out in faith to it's fullest potential without undo let up? Does this describe your prayer life? There is no perfect way to be fervent. It comes from your gut, from the inner most parts of your heart. A supercharged prayer life is filled with tenacity, passion, weeping, crying, intensity, and boldness.

A super charge prayer life can break the chains of those imprisoned physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually.

Consider what Jesus said about prayer.

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. Mathew 7:7

Asking shows faith

Seeking proves trust

Knocking reveals expectancy

When you ask, do you expect someone to answer? When you seek, do you expect to find? When you knock, do you believe someone will come to the door? The supercharged prayer life kicks your faith into over drive.

This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him. I John 5:14,15

The power of our prayers is not in our words but in our faith. Prayer is not saying the right words, in the right order with the right tone of piety. Prayer is honesty. Prayer is surrender. Prayer is a conversation, talking and listening with our Creator who seeks to supercharge our lives.

Supercharge Your Life With Fasting

Here are a few things you may not know about the atomic bomb:

Fat Man was the codename for the atomic bomb that was detonated over Nagasaki.

A survivor of Hiroshima's atomic bombing went to Boston in 1951 and won the Marathon.

Matter weighing about the same as a paper clip generated the power of the Hiroshima bomb.

That last fact tells us a lot about fasting, the third way you can supercharge your life.

Fasting is the atomic bomb of spiritual disciplines. If you want to get your body's attention, try not feeding it for a while. It will let you know real fast that it does not like it when you ignore it. Yet, fasting is the big gun you should be using if you want to wreak havoc on bad habits, addictions, a desperate need, or any behavior that's keeping you from living your best life.

When the Bible refers to "our fleshly desires" it is speaking of our old nature and our old appetites or wrongdoing before we asked Christ to forgive us.

For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. Galatians 5:17

Later, in the same chapter, the Apostle Paul says,

Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Galatians 5:24

Even Jesus said,

The Spirit gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. John 6:63

Fasting shows our flesh who's boss, cleanses our souls, takes our minds off consuming, and according to authors Kellyann Petrucci and Patrick Flynn of fast Diets for Dummies;

"foul body odor, putrid breath, pimples, ... and other undesirables are all indicators that your body is overrun by toxins and is in desperate need of a cleanse." *

This is no different than our hearts, souls, and spirits when they get polluted or weighed down with sin or lack of spiritual exercise and we exhibit behavior that does not line up with our new heart in Christ Jesus.

When we take time to fast and pray we alleviate our souls of spiritual toxins weighing us down! And, because we are not consumed with what to do with fleshly desires, God can reveal to us what we need to prioritize in our lives, gives us direction, guidance and breakthrough and help us in our time of need.

Through fasting, God shows us what supercharged authority looks like. Take a look at what Jesus told the disciples trying to cast out a demon and failed,

*And he said unto them, this kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting.
Mark 9:29 KJV*

There will be certain challenges you'll face that can only be overcome through prayer and fasting. Consider this, our sacrifice of a few meals could not only release us from life damaging problems but could also free someone else. That's supercharged faith.

The Lord told me, years ago, there will be:

Mountains that will not be moved
Blessings that will not come
Souls that will not be saved
Decisions that will God will not give
Valleys that will not be exalted
Breakthroughs that will not come

Unless there is prayer and fasting. Fasting propels us into the answers we have been searching for.

Jonah went to Nineveh and preached God's wrath on them if they did not repent. The people of Nineveh fasted, tore their clothes and repented. The nation avoided God's wrath for another 120 years because they received clarity about their ways through fasting. We can avoid disastrous decisions through fasting.

Fasting isn't a one day thing or a 40 day thing. Fasting is a life style. It's not just about going without food (some cannot for medical reasons) but we can also fast social media, tv, events and activities so we can simplify our lives and hear from God without all the busyness.

Jesus said, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Matthew 4:4

Think about what you can't live without and that is what you should probably be fasting. We can live without a lot of things, but revelation from God, for the believer, isn't one of them.

So whatever your spiritual pulse is, rev up your spiritual engine and begin to Supercharge your life with fasting! Again, kingdom principals bring kingdom results!

Supercharging Your Life With Worship

When you think of tents, I bet you think of camping not worship and yet a tent is exactly where the Israelites would come to meet with God.

"Then have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them. Make this tabernacle and all its furnishings exactly like the pattern I will show you. Exodus 25:8,9

You might ask, "Why does God need a tent to meet anyone?" He doesn't need one, we do. We are the ones who need a place to meet, to gather and to unify our souls with our Creator even if it's in nature.

In the heavens He has pitched a tent for the sun, like a bridegroom emerging from his chamber, like a champion rejoicing to run his course. Psalm 19:4-5

The whole universe is a tent where God's glory dwells.

And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." Isaiah 6:3

In other words, there's no excuse to not to be in his presence.

In fact, God can't be restricted to one church or one denomination, he wants to supercharge everyone who calls on his name.

"However, the Most High does not live in houses made by human hands." Acts 7:48

God made this possible through Christ's death on the cross and Christ giving us his Spirit to dwell with us, his temples.

For we are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people." 2 Corinthians 6:16

Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own. I Corinthians 6:19

So, what does all this talk of temples and tents have to do with our worshipping God?

Everything we do is worship

Worship isn't just a song or a series of songs. Worship is a lifestyle of surrender. The apostle Paul says,

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God--this is your true and proper worship.
Romans 12:1

How we live our lives honors God. The Jews also considered their work to be worship unto the Lord. When the church service ends our worship continues...

We worship through our practices

*"So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all to the glory of God."
I Corinthians 10:31*

As I mentioned previously, worship isn't just a song, but singing is one way of worshipping God as is communion, giving, prayer, service, and scripture reading. Too many believers segment their lives into "this is my time and this is God's time". All time is God's time so we ought to live to the glory of God all the time. God is seeking those who will worship him in spirit and truth. John 4:23

By living for the Lord 24/7, we are saying God is worth it, from where the word worship comes from. When we dedicate our lives to God, we are saying God is worthy of our best at all times and not just when we feel like it.

If you want to catapult your life into supercharge mode, live your life as if it is all worship to God. God gave us this life, let's honor God with it.

To recognize God in all facets of our lives is to recognize his active presence. If we recognize the presence of God, we act differently, we choose differently, we think differently than the person who thinks they only meet with God once a week in a physical house of worship.

The supercharged Christian lives in the presence of God and is impacted by it like Moses was impacted by the burning bush.

"Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." Exodus 3:5

Moses was also impacted when meeting with God on the mountain to speak to Him,

But whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with Him, he would remove the veil until he came out. And when he came out, he would tell the Israelites what he had been commanded, and the Israelites would see that the face of Moses was radiant. So Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the LORD.
Exodus 34:34,35

The supercharged Christian recognizes God's presence, draws near to it and dwells in it. And their faces are ever radiant serving the Lord. Psalms 34:5 This is worship.

Supercharge Your Life Through Testimony

If you've ever witnessed a car accident, or been in a car accident, you may have been called upon to give your testimony. Your testimony is the recollection of events, as you saw them or experienced them.

This is no difference in sharing our testimony of what the Lord has done in our own lives. In his first of three letters, John starts his letter by saying,

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched--this we proclaim concerning the Word of life. I John 1:1

John shares what he has heard, what he's seen, and what he's touched or experienced. This is a compelling testimony as one who walked with Christ. This is a firsthand account. Each of our stories is a firsthand account of what the Lord has done for us.

If you want to live a supercharged Christian life, share your testimony. Share your story. No story is too small or too big to give God glory. You don't have to be a drug dealer on death's door, saved by angels to have a testimony. Your testimony can be as simple as the blind man Jesus healed,

He replied, "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!"

The power of our testimony is not in how graphic it is or dramatic our conversion was, but in the actual telling of our story.

Our testimony encourages others

You see, when we share what God has done for us, it encourages other believers in their journey with Christ. The Apostle Paul was encouraged by testimonies,

I always thank my God, making mention of you in my prayers, because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints. Philemon 1:4,5

People who hear about God moving in the lives of others, supercharges their faith. In past revivals like the Welsh revival, people would read the testimony of what God was doing in their local publications, and get inspired and supercharged by Holy Spirit! Revival would then break out and spread from city to city, and nation to nation!

Our testimony encourages us

When we are sharing our testimony of God's goodness, we begin to recount the deeds God has done in the past, is presently doing and it gives us hope for what God will do in the future.

Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ. Romans 10:17

When we share, we supercharge ourselves. We build our faith as we share with others. When we refresh others, we refresh ourselves.

I pulled up to the post office once and a man asked me for directions. I asked him where he was going. He shared that he was checking himself into rehab. So I shared my testimony with him and prayed with him and he received Christ right in the post office parking lot. He went on his way rejoicing into rehab with the advantage of knowing Christ. He entered rehab before he ever entered rehab. Both of us were supercharged.

In the Welsh Revival of the early 1900's, Evan Roberts preached four points and I have lived by them to be the best of my ability:

Walk in Repentance

Walk in forgiveness

Obey the Holy Spirit instantly

Testify about the Lord Jesus Christ, openly

If you want revival in your heart, testify about what God has done. You don't have to be behind the pulpit or in church, you could be at a post office like me and have a chance to supercharge someone's life with what God has done for you.

The more you testify the more divine appointments God will bring you because there are people who need to hear your unique story and it could change their life.

What has Jesus done for you? Share it and be supercharged.

They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death. Rev. 12:11

Supercharge Your Life Speaking Words of Life

The tongue has the power of life and death,
and those who love it will eat its fruit. Proverbs 18:21

Let's face it, negativity doesn't supercharge anything. Not only does it not supercharge our faith, it actually chips away at it until there is nothing left. That's the power of our words. We can build up or destroy with them.

We can curse our life with negativity. Think about it, do you say things like,

I'm not good enough to...

That's never going to happen because...

I never catch a break...

Constantly thinking and speaking this way is like taking a sledge hammer to your future. You're mapping a future you don't really want because being negative is easier than finding God in a tough situation. Negativity is just lazy faith.

Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.

Ephesians 4:29

Our words have a purpose. Words aren't meaningless puffs of air exploding from our mouth. If they were Jesus wouldn't have said that we would be judged by them (Matthew 12:37). Your words can build others up or tear others down. You can supercharge others or drain other people with your words.

Building up others includes

Telling others what they're doing right. Telling them what God says about them!

Telling others what they could be. Being a prophet of good:

But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort. I Cor. 14:3

Speaking forth what the upside is instead of joining in on their downside thinking.

Building ourselves up includes

Believing and voicing God's promises for our lives.

Believing and voicing God's thoughts, not others towards us.

Believing and voicing the future wants for us instead of focusing on our current situation.

Positivity is more than gimmick. Using our words to build up others, builds us up as well. Words build faith.

Now faith is the assurance (title deed, confirmation) of things hoped for (divinely guaranteed), and the evidence of things not seen [the conviction of their reality—faith comprehends as fact what cannot be experienced by the physical senses].

Hebrews 11:1 AMP

Faith is believing that God has signed over his blessing (title deed) to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus. God has given us a choice; confirm His promises with our words or negate God's blessing with doubt.

Why do athletic teams circle up and someone gives a pep talk? To build faith that they can win. This is no different for our lives. We speak life so we, and others, can have life. Do you want your business to succeed? Do you want your marriage to make it? Do you want to win? Speak words of life.

Warning: being around negative people will drain your faith. Start speaking life and seeing God's best in every situation and they could change or they'll find some other negative people to be around. Misery loves company.

Words of life draws other people to you who want to supercharge their lives as well. There is a leadership maxim that says, "You do not draw what you want, you draw who you are." If you want to surround yourself with positive people, filled with faith and hope, then start being that person.

Be committed to supercharging others by speaking words of life and you will supercharge yourself .

Supercharge Your Life By Being Filled With The Holy Spirit

Consider the day you came to know Jesus and were baptized. Think about your sins being forgiven and your life finding purpose in following Jesus. Were you supercharged that day? I bet you were, but is that all there is?

Recommitting your life can also be a thrill if you have wandered away from the Lord, but after so many recommitments, we can lose that supercharge after a while. There's no time like the first time we come to know Christ. So, is there anything after coming to know Christ that can bring a newness and vibrancy to our faith? Yes, Jesus said,

For John baptized with[a] water, but in a few days you will be baptized with[b] the Holy Spirit.” Acts 1:5

So, most baptisms are with water. It is a thrilling moment to do what Jesus did and be submerged under the water and to rise up symbolically of the death and resurrection of Jesus, entering a new life. It's like some commercials say, “But wait, there's more!”

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”
Acts 1:8

Consider the disciples right after Jesus had gone to the cross but before His resurrection.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders. John 20:19

They had followed Jesus for three years, seen miracles, were part of miracles, performed miracles, but now, they were hiding. They had been supercharged by following Jesus. While they were hiding, Jesus showed up and did this,

Again, Jesus said to them, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so also I am sending you.” When He had said this, He breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit. John 20:21-22

When Jesus breathed on the disciples, this was their salvation experience. They literally had a come to Jesus moment. When you come to Christ the Holy Spirit comes to live within you. Then comes the promise Jesus shared earlier in Acts 1:8.

Jesus told the disciples to wait on the promise of God, the power of the Holy Spirit. They did, and this is what happened:

When the day of Pentecost came, the believers were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like a mighty rushing wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw tongues like flames of a fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Acts 2:1-4

This was a supercharged moment if there ever had been one. They received the Holy Spirit earlier, to salvation, now the Holy Spirit came upon all of them.

Now, the same disciples, who were once hiding in fear were supercharged when the Holy Spirit filled them to overflowing. The disciples hit the streets declaring the wonders of God in the language of those who had been visiting for the Feast of Pentecost.

Peter, who had betrayed Jesus and ran back to fishing was now declaring the message of Jesus to the masses.

This experience was not just for the disciples, this is for believers everywhere, today! Look at what happen in Samaria:

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. On their arrival, they prayed for them to receive the Holy Spirit. For the Holy Spirit had not yet fallen upon any of them; they had simply been baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. Acts 8:14-17

And look at what happens at Cornelius's house:

While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard his message. All the circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were amazed that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles. For they heard them speaking in tongues and exalting God.

Being baptized in the Holy Spirit is a gift that keeps on giving. Unlike being saved for the first time or recommitting our lives to Christ, the Holy Spirit can keep filling us so we can do God's will and move in a greater power in our lives and ministry!

The Spirit is in us, and comes on us supercharging our lives daily so we can make a difference in our world.

Get supercharged and be filled with the Spirit continually!!! Ephesians 5:18
